- 8 duced into interstate commerce on or after January 1,

10 SEC. 3. REPORT TO CONGRESS.

- 11 (a) Report.—Not later than 2 years after the date
- 12 of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Health and
- 13 Human Services (referred to in this section as the "Sec-
- 14 retary") shall submit to the Committee on Health, Edu-
- 15 cation, Labor, and Pensions of the Senate and the Com-
- 16 mittee on Energy and Commerce of the House of Rep-
- 17 resentatives a report on scientific opportunities in food al-
- 18 lergy research. Such report shall—
- 19 (1) identify opportunities and challenges related

- 21 (A) developing effective food allergy
- diagnostics;
- (B) preventing the onset of food allergies;

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(D) developing new therapeutics to treat
and manage food allergies; and
(E) curing food allergies;
(2) provide updates on data collection activities
related to food allergies and specific allergens and
identify gaps in such data collection activities; and
(3) recommend specific strategies to overcome
the challenges identified under paragraph (1), in-
cluding strategies to support the most promising
areas of food allergy research that could lead to al-
ternatives to current forms of disease management
and identify allergens of emerging prevalence.
(b) Publication.—The Secretary shall make the re-
port under subsection (a) available on the internet website
of the Department of Health and Human Services.
