A BILL

To suspend the entry of covered aliens in response to the fentanyl public health crisis.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Alan Shao Jr.
- 5 Fentanyl Public Health Emergency and Overdose Preven-
- 6 tion Act".
- 7 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 8 Congress finds the following:

1	(1) More than 100,000 Americans died from
2	drug overdoses during 2021, with the majority of
3	such deaths caused by fentanyl.
4	(2) Fentanyl is a potent synthetic opioid drug
5	that is 50 times more potent than heroin and 100
6	times more potent than morphine.
7	(3) Fentanyl is involved in more deaths of
8	Americans younger than 50 years of age than any
9	other cause of death, including heart disease, cancer,
10	homicide, suicide, and other accidents.
11	(4) In 2022, the United States Drug Enforce-
12	ment Agency seized 50,000,000 fentanyl-laced pills
13	and over 10,000 pounds of fentanyl powder, which
14	is enough fentanyl to kill every American.
15	(5) Just 2 milligrams of fentanyl is considered
16	a lethal dose.
17	(6) The smuggling of fentanyl into the United
18	States constitutes a major public health crisis.
19	SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.
20	In this Act:
21	(1) COVERED ALIEN.—The term "covered
22	alien" means any person who—
23	(A) is attempting to unlawfully enter the
24	United States from Canada or from Mexico;

1	(B) does not possess the required travel
2	documents to be admitted to the United States;
3	and
4	(C) is being held at a point of entry or a
5	Border Patrol station to facilitate immigration
6	processing.
7	(2) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
8	the Secretary of Homeland Security.
9	SEC. 4. SUSPENDING THE INTRODUCTION OF COVERED
10	ALIENS INTO THE UNITED STATES DUE TO
11	THE FENTANYL PUBLIC HEALTH CRISIS.
12	(a) In General.—Beginning on the date of the en-
13	actment of this Act, the admittance of covered aliens into
14	the United States is suspended to protect the public
15	health.
16	(b) Relocation.—Covered aliens who attempt to
17	enter the United States, either through a point of entry
18	or between points of entry, while the suspension described
19	
	in subsection (a) remains in place shall be returned to
20	their country of origin or to the country from which they

- 1 (c) Repatriation Flights.—The Secretary is au-
- 2 thorized to transport covered aliens being relocated pursu-
- 3 ant to subsection (b) on scheduled repatriation flights, on
- 4 a space available basis.
